Preserve and conserve your lakes.
The Three Lakes Waterfront Association promotes and encourages responsible stewardship of Wisconsin waters through education. Working with other state organizations, the Association provides members with information on the best ways to protect our lakes.



Protect your property values.
Property values in the Northwoods are directly related to the quality of our lake waters. If we are not vigilant stewards of these natural resources, the attraction of these lakes will suffer. The TLWA is organized to preserve and protect Wisconsin inland waters, their watersheds and ecosystems in the vicinity of Three Lakes.



Promote water-related safety practices and regulations.
In 2008 a DVD was developed focused on water safety. This was specifically for the Three Lakes area and provides information about the Chain and Aquatic Invasive Species. It was distributed to area businesses, resorts and TLWA members.



Stay up-to-date on the fight against Aquatic Invasive Species.
Over the past several years, the TLWA has actively pursued grants to help cover the financial burden of fighting Aquatic Invasive Species such as Eurasian Water Milfoil. To date, the TLWA has been awarded over \$100,000 in grant monies from the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources. With this money and over 5,000 volunteer hours from members, thousands of educational packets have been distributed.

Encourage ecologically sound sanitation standards and practices.
The Association acquires, disseminates and exchanges information to members on water and land use, related environmental matters, zoning and other pertinent laws and regulations.



Protect native wildlife and natural habitat.
TLWA coordinates joint endeavors with similar organizations to promote ecological environmental education and activities.

Members receive two newsletters each year to provide updates on the progress of the TLWA's activities. The web site provides more timely updates and links to other information and resources.
